William Wilkie Collins (8 January 1824–23 September 1889) was an English novelist, playwright, and short story writer. His best-known works are *The Woman in White* (1859), *No Name* (1862), *Armadale* (1866) and *The Moonstone* (1868). The last is considered the first...
